Congratulations to the new inductees to the Coventry High School Alumni Hall of Fame. Inductees for 2021 Coventry High School Alumni Hall of Fame were selected by the Selection Committee and will be inducted on November 4th at Quidnessett CC with a reception at 6 PM and dinner at 7 PM. The inductees include: Carolyn Chirnside, a former English teacher and department head at CHS; Chief Stanley J, Mruk who was the Anthony Fire Chief and Civil Defense Director for Coventry; The Olde Theatre Diner recognizing owners Ernest Nardolillo '77 and Sharon Flippo '83, for their years of community service; and Dr. Mary St. Amand who has run a success veterinary practice for many years. The Coventry High School Alumni Association presented scholarships to 20 Coventry High School seniors this totaling \$34,000. This represents a 13.3% increase over last year and was made possible through the generosity of donors that include the St. Pierre Family, The Murley/Jacobson Family, The Olde Theatre Diner; the WISE Scholarship sponsored by the Sweeney Family (Michele St. Pierre Sweeney '81) and Nicole St. Jean '04; 2 scholarships sponsored by Accel Lifestyles LLC, manufacturer of anti-bacterial athletic clothing (Megan Doucette Eddings '99); the Casacalenda family and West Warwick Auto Body (Phil and Carmella (Marsocci) '78); and the Macomber Family. For a complete list, check below.

Two new scholarships were added this year, one established by the children of Sonja M. (Murley) Jacobson and the other presented to the recipient of the Ardis W. Barbour Award, which honors former principal Ardis W. Barbour and which has been presented annually since 1971. Funds are being solicited for this scholarship to make it available into the future. \$7000 have been raised to date with a goal of \$10,000 to \$11,000 by the end of 2022.

Several scholarships also include a match of \$6000 by the Coventry Teachers' Scholarship Fund headed by Suzanne Tracy. We are indebted to the administration, teachers, staff, and employees of the Coventry Public Schools for their support and generosity.

These scholarships bring our total donations since 2011 to \$164,000.

Day 3 Reunion @ Tavern on the Hill in West Greenwich


Day 4 Pats/Miami game at Old Theatre Diner

Anne Proffitt Dupre '70

Anne Proffitt Dupre graduated from Coventry High School in 1970 and then from University of Rhode Island with degrees in history and psychology in 1974. After teaching for 5 years, Anne found her passion in the law. She attended law school at the University of Georgia where she graduated first in her class in 1988 and served as editor-in-chief of the Georgia Law Review. She served as a judicial clerk to U.S. Supreme Court Justice Harry A. Blackmun following her clerkship with Judge J.L. Edmondson of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 11th Circuit. Anne then practiced law with the Washington, D.C., firm of Shaw, Pittman, Potts & Trowbridge.

In 1994 she joined the faculty at the University of Georgia, School of Law where she was a teacher, mentor, and researcher until her untimely death.

Nationally recognized as an expert in education law and policy, and she published 2 books and numerous articles and book chapters. Throughout her life, Anne pursued her interests with the same passion that she pursued the law. A brilliant woman, she excelled at everything she did, seemingly without effort.

Anne received the Blue Key Young Alumnus Award presented by UGA's Blue Key chapter. Her love of teaching and dedication to students was acknowledged in many ways. She was honored by law students with the 2011 Faculty Book Award for Excellence in Teaching, which is now the C. Ronald Ellington Award for Excellence in Teaching and the John C. O'Byrne Award for Significant Contributions Furthering Faculty-Student Relations. Anne will serve as an enduring example of the world of opportunity open to student with talent and the desire to work hard to develop it.



John Kowal '87

John Kowal grew up in Coventry, RI and graduated from Coventry High School in 1987. During his time at CHS he played on the basketball and baseball teams. He attended Worcester Polytechnic Institute and graduated with a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering in 1991.

He started his career in engineering for KMC, Inc in West Greenwich, RI, as a test and design engineer of high-speed fluid film bearings and dampers that are used in turbomachinery for power generation, and the oil and gas industries. Soon thereafter he took on numerous sales engineering roles selling me-

chanical products including bearings, vibration monitoring equipment, customized mechanical seals, couplings and 5 axis machined parts.

He then shifted into the medical industry where he has spent the last 23 years. His first role was as a Southeast District Sales Manager for Radionics focusing on image guided surgery and radiation therapy to be used to treat cancer patients. He worked at CTI selling PET (Positron Emission Tomography) imaging systems and cyclotrons used to image and diagnose numerous oncology and other patient conditions.

For the last 16 years, John has worked in numerous sales, and sales management roles, and has been the President of the Americas for Varian Medical, a Siemens Healthineers company, managing a \$1.5B business and over 1000 employees throughout the US, Canada, and Latin America. Varian produces hardware and software systems to treat millions of cancer patients annually with targeted radiation therapy.

John has lived in various parts of the country over the last 20+ years including Boston, Tampa, Buffalo, Colorado and has resided in Dallas for the past 11 years. John's wife is Kim, and they have two sons, Brooks (14) and Jacoby (12).

John vividly remembers his time at CHS and the incredible teachers that shaped his passion and thirst for knowledge particularly in math and science, including Mr. DiMicco's physics class. John never could have imagined the incredible impact that this knowledge would have on him and the career opportunists it would create. He is thankful that these experiences at CHS can be utilized to work with medical physicists, physicians, and other oncology clinicians to positively impact the lives of the millions of cancer patients and their families that his company touches each year.
