New Scholarships Added by CHSAA for 2023

The CHSAA, due to the generosity of its donors and the efforts of the CHSAA committee, was able to donate \$38,000 in scholarships this year to the 23 CHS seniors. Three new scholarships will be added for 2023:

Thanks to the generosity of the Murray Family, a new \$1000 scholarship has been established for 2023. The scholarship will honor Francis Herbert Murray who passed away in February, 2021 at the age of 76 from complication of COVID-19. Frank graduated from Hope High School in 1962 and then went on to earn a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Rhode Island in 1966. Frank was employed as an Actuarial Analyst for Blue Cross & Blue Shield of RI for 28 years before retiring. He was also interested in and enjoyed the real estate business. The CHSAA will offer this scholarship to a member of the class of 2023 who plans to further his or her education to prepare for a vocational career. The Coventry High School Alumni Association (CHSAA) is a nonprofit, 501-(3)(c) tax-exempt organization founded in 2009. Our mission is to: 1) provide scholarships for CHS seniors, 2) provide funds for school educational projects, and 3) recognize successful and community-minded individuals who have attended CHS, been employed at CHS, or who have been benefactors to the CHS community.

Since 2011, the CHSAA has awarded \$202,000 in scholarships including \$38,000 for this year. Over the last five years, \$11,550 has been donated for school projects. Our goal is to help students identify their career pathways before leaving high school to minimize the wasting of time and money by changing colleges or majors, extending the time, and increasing the cost of college.

All of the committee members are volunteers, so virtually all the money raised through fundraisers or donations goes to the students of CHS.
